Notes

Alito voted with KBR, which technically won the case, but the court opposed KBR's (and Verizon's) interpretation of the FCA.

Roberts voted with L.A., but Microsoft's brief sided with Patel.

Roberts voted with Cisco, as did HP's brief. All of Alito's holdings voted with Commil, as did Alito, except Oracle, which sided with Cisco.

Roberts, Alito and the companies whose shares they both own sided with Kimble. So did Breyer's companies, but he voted with Marvel.

All three justices' companies sided with Obergefell, but Roberts and Alito did not.

Roberts sided with Bouaphakeo but Microsoft, Alito and all of Alito's companies did not.

Time, Inc., sided with Spokeo and Microsoft sided with Robins, but we are regarding the case as a wash.

All three justices' companies sided with UT-Austin, but Roberts and Alito did not.
