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Methodology

PSB conducted online interviews from June 8-15, 2018 among n=1,131 U.S. likely voters. The margin of error for this study is +/- 2.91% at the 95% confidence level and larger for subgroups. Some percentages may add to more or less than 100% due to rounding. Where applicable, tracked findings reflect an October 2018 PSB online study (https://fixthecourt.com/wp-content/uploads/2018/10/October-2018-TL-poll-results.pdf) of n=1,000 U.S. likely voters conducted on behalf of Fix the Court.
