### Enrollment / Getting Started

**1. How do I enroll in the program?**

*Complete the HIDS Enrollment form located on the [USMS public website](#) and submit to the HIDS mailbox [HIDS.USMS@usdoj.gov](mailto:HIDS.USMS@usdoj.gov). The form is located at the bottom of the web page.*

**2. Am I required to have a home visit from the USMS before I can enroll in HIDS and be reimbursed?**

*We highly recommend and ask that a district Judicial Security Unit (JSU) representative be present during the service providers initial meeting and when preparing the quote. JSUs can perform a personalized Residential Survey for vulnerabilities at your request.*

**3. Who can I contact if I need help or support selecting the proper equipment, service provider, program options, and/or ensuring I meet the requirements for my HIDS?**

*Please contact your district JSU or the HIDS Program Office with any questions or concerns. A JSU representative should be present when you speak to service provider(s) to ensure you are receiving accurate information and to lend their security expertise.*

**4. Security systems and options are complicated. Can the USMS decide on a system for the Judges?**

*Though the USMS can't decide on the details of specific systems or providers for judges any longer, the USMS can make recommendations on the equipment a judge may wish to consider and can also point judges in the direction of quality providers in their area. The district Judicial Security Inspector (JSI) and HIDS Program Office are knowledgeable and available to help.*

### HIDS Cap, Requirements, and Limitations

**5. What is the monitoring cap and what does it include?**

*In FY2023, the yearly monitoring cap was raised to \$800. Monitoring funds can be used for monthly security fees, including alarm and video monitoring. Maintenance and service call items may also be claimed within the \$800 limit. This includes batteries, camera service, system adjustments, etc. Check your individual contract to see if any maintenance items are already included each month.*

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQS)

### Judicial Security Division (JSD) Home Intrusion Detection Systems (HIDS)

**6. What are the minimum features of the HIDS that a judge must have in order to be eligible for reimbursement?**

*There are no minimum set of features needed for reimbursement. JSD strongly recommends that*

However,

*none of these features are mandatory for reimbursement.*

**7. A Judge contacted a provider and was quoted a price that is more than the reimbursement limit of \$2500 for installation. What can they do now?**

*The alarm system industry and the large national providers often subcontract installations. This can lead to great differences in pricing for similar services and equipment. If a judge received a quote above the authorized reimbursement limit, it may be necessary for a JSI to help him/her seek other estimates. If the judge has received a competitive quote from multiple vendors that are all above the authorized limit, contact the HIDS Program Office so the quote can be reviewed and approved before committing to a security provider.*

## Reimbursement

**8. How do I submit a reimbursement request?**

*Complete the HIDS Reimbursement form, provided by your JSU or the HIDS Program Office, and submit to the HIDS mailbox along with proof of payment, invoices, and work orders. The HIDS Reimbursement form can be found on the [USMS public website](#). (Bottom of the web page.)*

**9. What if I need upgrades, new equipment, or have faulty components at some point?**

*The USMS is committed to ensuring you have a working system and your residence is secure. Reimbursement for equipment upgrades due to life cycle replacement will be available as needed. If you have a malfunctioning system or a faulty component, please submit an appeal and a quote for the repair to [HIDS.USMS@usdoj.gov](mailto:HIDS.USMS@usdoj.gov). We will review any quotes for installation or repairs prior to a judge committing or making payment to ensure your purchase is covered.*

**10. If I have two homes, may I be reimbursed for a vacation home instead of my primary home?**

**11. Can I pay for monitoring annually, biannually, quarterly, or monthly?**

*You may pay for monitoring as frequently as you choose or whenever your security company requires. HIDS recommends paying for the entire fiscal year in advance.*

**12. If I pay monthly monitoring, can I wait to submit them all at once?**

*You may submit reimbursement requests as frequently as you choose; you do not have to submit monthly just because you pay monthly.*

**13. Can I be reimbursed for maintenance costs to my security system?**

*Yes, maintenance costs are reimbursable under the \$800 provided for annual monitoring and maintenance. Some vendors may include limited maintenance under your contract.*

**14. If I pay annually for monitoring, can I still be reimbursed for the full amount regardless of fiscal year?**

*If you pay annually and your billing period crosses fiscal years you will only be reimbursed for the current or past fiscal years. We are unable to reimburse for future fiscal years prior to receiving Congressional funding.*

**15. How does the USMS reimburse when a request covers multiple fiscal years?**

*In response to the HIDS Judicial Survey, the USMS is now prorating billing periods that cover two fiscal years. You will be reimbursed for the portion in the current fiscal year immediately and then we will create another HIDS record which will be reviewed and reimbursed once the new fiscal year begins, and funding is received from Congress.*

**16. Can I be reimbursed for annual fees, tax, city permit fees, etc?**

*Yes, this will be covered under the annual \$800 provided for monitoring/maintenance.*

**17. Is there a deadline for submitting reimbursement requests?**

*No, there is not a hard deadline for submitting reimbursement requests. However, fiscal year funding is reallocated or removed after a specified time frame. Please contact the HIDS Program Office if you have any questions.*

**18. What are acceptable forms of proof of payment?**

*Credit card statement (may be redacted), bank statement, an invoice that shows paid or zero balance, cleared check (front and back). \*Some security providers also offer online billing histories which are also acceptable.*

**19. Can the USMS send me a reminder to submit my reimbursement request?**

*Regrettably, we cannot offer this service due to the numerous judges and their unique, personal payment schedules.*

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQS)

### Judicial Security Division Home Intrusion Detection System

#### **20. Why do I have to provide proof that my system or monthly monitoring was paid?**

*You are required to provide proof that your system or monthly monitoring bill was paid based on the following Federal Financial Management requirements as iterated by the USMS Financial Services Division: 31 U.S. Code § 1501 “An amount shall be recorded as an obligation of the United States Government only when supported by documentary evidence”; 31 U.S. Code § 3528 “A certifying official certifying a voucher is responsible for the information stated in the certificate, voucher, and supporting records”; 431 U.S. Code § 3325 “A disbursing official in the executive branch of the United States Government shall examine a voucher if necessary to decide if it is in proper form”, Treasury Financial Manual Section 2050—Basic Disbursement Requirements, [agencies] disbursements with sufficient information on the disbursement vouchers, or on documents attached to them, to enable the audit of transactions of certifying and disbursing offices.”*

## Appeal

#### **21. What if the USMS denies my reimbursement request because it is over the installation cap?**

*You may submit an appeal request. The appeal form can be found on the [USMS public website](#) (bottom of the web page) or you may reach out to your JSU, the HIDS Program Office, or your Judiciary Security Officer from the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts (AOUSC). We will ensure you receive the appropriate form. Appeals are only for installation or component repairs. Monitoring may not be appealed.*

#### **22. Can I be notified when reimbursements have been approved or reimbursement was paid?**

*An automated email is sent to the submitter once the request has been received, once the request has been approved, and once the payment has been processed. If you have any questions, you may always reach out to the HIDS Program Office at [HIDS.USMS@usdoj.gov](mailto:HIDS.USMS@usdoj.gov).*

*\*The automated email will go to the email address that was used to submit the request.*

## Training

#### **23. Is there any training for Judges on how to complete the forms or the process of the HIDS services?**

*USMS JSUs provide annual security training within each district. JSUs are also familiar with HIDS and will gladly assist with forms or questions. You may also reach out to the HIDS Program Office for assistance at any time. Many vendors also have YouTube channels for specific education on system components, billing histories, and trouble shooting.*
